School and Community

The Affiliated High School of South China Normal University, and abbreviated as Huafu in Chinese, is located in Guangzhou, China. It was established in 1952 and is co-managed by the Ministry of Education of Guangdong Province and South China Normal University. It is widely regarded as the most prestigious and high-achieving high school in Guangdong province.

HFI(Huafu International Department), founded in 2004 and accredited by the Education Department of Guangdong Province, operates as a comprehensive three- or four-year high school. Our school is in the process of accreditation by WASC, with full accreditation anticipated in 2026. Students may enroll in either Grade 9 or Grade 10, depending on their academic pathway. The International Department employs over 91 professionals, including teachers from the United States, United Kingdom, Australia, India, Ireland, China, and other countries. Seventy-five percent of our teachers hold Master's degrees or higher. HFI is one of the most selective high school programs in South China, admitting only 10% of applicants annually.

School Mission & Vision

HFI fosters students' self-awareness and self-motivation, empowering them to make informed choices about clubs, classes, colleges, majors, and careers that shape their growth and deepen their understanding of their abilities, interests, and limitations. Through a rigorous curriculum, students develop critical and creative thinking, enabling them to solve problems, think independently, and reflect on their experiences to become effective leaders. They also cultivate strong social skills and emotional intelligence, engaging directly with teachers and administrators to support their academic growth and advocate for change. Additionally, students build community awareness by taking on responsibilities as active members, gaining a broader perspective on the world around them.

Curriculum

Students at HFI follow a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum. HFI's program is based on an American curriculum, supplemented by traditional Chinese courses and supported by high-quality teaching, testing standards, and academic procedures. All classes at HFI are taught by professionally credentialed teachers, the majority of whom are native English speakers. In Grades 9 and 10, students take both pre-AP courses and approved Chinese high school subjects. Classes taught in Chinese are highly rigorous; such as mathematics, are more advanced than the AP Calculus curriculum. In Grades 11 and 12, students follow an intensive AP curriculum, with an English course, at either Standard or AP level. To broaden academic offerings beyond the AP program, the school provides additional subjects such as Philosophy, Logic, Sociology, Film Studies, Drama, Advanced Calculus, and Linear Algebra, which are equivalent to second-year university mathematics courses. In Grades 9 and 10, the primary language of instruction is Chinese (except for English classes); in Grades 11 and 12, instruction is primarily in English. Courses such as English for Academic Purposes, Introduction to History, and Introduction to Musical Theater are exclusively offered to students in the four-year program. HFI is organized on a two-semester system. The school year offers 40 weeks of instruction, from mid-August to mid-June.

Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate, students are required to pass three years of English, plus at least one course from each of Social Science, Science, Math and Art groups. In practice, students often enroll in twice this number of courses.

On-Campus Extra-Curricular Activities

Students at HFI participate in a diverse array of clubs, campus activities, and art festivals. Activities for this year include Campus Sports Meetings, Volunteer/Social Service, Student Council, Art Festival/Contest, National English Speech Contest, National Debate Contest, etc. There so far are over 100 clubs in HFI, including Mad Science Club, Cuisine Club, American Football Club, The Voice school magazine, Finance Club, and HFI Photos Club, etc. Such activities are generally student-initiated and student-directed.

Transcript

HFI provides an official English high school transcript for all enrolled students. In the Chinese education system, students complete Grade 9 in middle school rather than high school. At HFI, students in the four-year track begin in Grade 9, while those in the three-year track start in Grade 10. The students in the three-year track are required to submit their Grade 9 transcripts upon admission to our program.
